Overview

Revisit the glorious days of Wodeyar dynasty as you take a walk through the largest palace in India. Witness the splendid architecture and the glory of the past that will enthral the history lover in you. A home for all the tourists of Karnataka, Mysore palace is one of the most visited tourist destination in this state. The palace is decorated grandly every year during the world famous Dasara festival and the rich heritage of Wodeyar dynasty is witnessed during the celebration of this festival.

Chamundi hill makes it to the list of 'must visit tourist places in Mysore' as many tourists come to this hill to pay deference to Chamundi Devi. Within the city limits of Mysore this place is most known for the famous temple on its hill top. The temple was built in the 11th century and has been renovated and turned into a tourist spot.

Mysore^[5] (Listeni/ma?'s??r/), officially renamed as Mysuru, is the third most populous and the third largest city^[6] in the state of Karnataka, India. Located in the foothills of the Chamundi Hills about 146 km (91 mi) southwest of the state capital Bangalore, it is spread across an area of 128.42 km² (50 sq mi). According to the provisional results of the 2011 national census of India, the population is 887,446. Mysore City Corporation is responsible for the civic administration of the city, which is also the headquarters of the Mysore district and the Mysore division.

Mysore served as the capital city of the Kingdom of Mysore for nearly six centuries, from 1399 until 1956. The Kingdom was ruled by the Wodeyar dynasty, with a brief period of interregnum in the 1860s and 70s when Hyder Ali and Tipu Sultan were in power. Patrons of art and culture, the Wodeyars contributed significantly to the cultural

growth of the city and the state. The cultural ambiance and achievements of Mysore earned it the sobriquet Cultural Capital of Karnataka.

Ooty, short for Ootacamund (an anglicized name for Udhagamandalam), is a popular hill resort in the state of Tamil Nadu in Southern India. The name Udhagamandalam is derived from the Toda word "othakal-mund" which means "house in mountains". Ooty stands at 2,240 m (7,347) feet above sea level in the Nilgiri mountain range. It was founded in the 19th century by the British, and served as the summer headquarters of the Madras Presidency.

Tour Itinerary

Day 01 :Bangalore:

Pick up from Bangalore Railway station or air port, check in hotel. After fresh up and breakfast, proceed to sightseeing i.e., Vishwesarayya museum, Lal Bagh and Iskcon Temple. Overnight stay at hotel followed by warm dinner.

Day 02 :Bangalore – Mysore

After breakfast, drive to Mysore (145kms / 4hrs). En route Sri Rangapatnam temple. After arrival in Mysore, proceed to local sightseeing i.e., Maharaja Palace, Brindavan Gardens etc. After sightseeing, check in to hotel and overnight stay at hotel followed by warm dinner.

Day 03 :Mysore – Coorg Sightseeing

After breakfast, drive to Coorg local sightseeing i.e., Golden temple, Dubare forest, and Abbey waterfalls then after evening return back to Mysore stay overnight at hotel.

Day 04 :Mysore – Ooty

After breakfast, drive to Ooty (130kms / 3hrs 45min). En route Mudumalai Forest, bandipur national park. After arrival in Ooty, proceed to local sightseeing i.e., Ooty Lake, Botanical Gardens etc. After sightseeing, check in to hotel and overnight stay at hotel followed by warm dinner.

Day 05 : Ooty – Bangalore

After breakfast, drive back to Bangalore (281kms / 6hrs). En route Pykara Lake, Filmy Chakkar. After arrival, drop at Bangalore Railway station to start return journey as per schedule to Home town with colorful memories with Universal Tours & Travels.
